Pre-Licensing/Pre-Education Frequently Asked Questions

What is the most important application response concern? Be thorough and honest. Incorrect or incomplete response information can and does cause license applications to be denied.

What other application issue frequently creates problems? Failure to realize that the word ever means EV-ER. (The exception is that subsequently expunged criminal history information does <u>not</u> need to be disclosed.)

Will a criminal record keep me from being approved for an auctioneer or auction firm license? Possibly, but each application is reviewed on its own merits, and on a case-by-case basis. Further, any criminal history-based denial decision can only come following consideration and analysis of the factors listed in N.C.G.S. 93B-8.1(b)(b1) and N.C.G.S. 85B-3.2(d).

I happen to have some criminal record issues in my past. Prior to beginning any education or sending in a license application, is there a way that I can learn if my particular situation will preclude me from being issued a license? YES. Petition for Predetermination

Do I have to complete auctioneering school before seeking a predetermination decision from the Board? No. If you suspect that your criminal history may ultimately keep you from being approved for a license, you may want to request a predetermination decision from the Board prior to investing the time, energy, and expense involved in attending auction school.

Why does the application ask about financial matters? Upon being issued a license, auctioneers are permitted to assume the fiduciary duty of being trusted with the property (and proceeds from the sale of property) of their auction clients.

Will adverse financial information in my past preclude me from being approved for a license? Possibly. The Board assesses the past and current status of applicants and may deny licensure upon determination that a demonstrated lack of Financial responsibility exists.

<u>Do I have to provide a credit report?</u> The Board may require a current credit report in certain circumstances, including bankruptcies, unsatisfied judgments, and worthless check criminal convictions.

<u>Can I get a pre-determination decision regarding financial issues from the Board regarding financial issues prior to submitting a license application?</u> No. North Carolina law requires occupational licensing boards to make criminal history-based predetermination decisions when requested, but not for any other reason.

If my application is not approved by the Board, is there any opportunity to appeal that decision? Yes. Any applicant whose license application has initially been denied has 30 days from the date of notification to request a formal administrative hearing before the Board. This is an opportunity to challenge information, present evidence, present witnesses, and offer testimony prior to the Board reaching any final agency decision.

PREDETERMINATION OF LICENSURE

An individual with a criminal history may petition a board at any time, including before an individual starts or completes any mandatory education or training requirements, for a predetermination of whether the individual's criminal history will likely disqualify the individual from obtaining a license.

Petition for Predetermination

Pursuant to House Bill 770, which was ratified on June 28, 2019, Occupational Licensing Boards have the power to deny a license due to a criminal conviction pursuant to 93B-8.1(b)(b1). However, the following factors must be considered:

- (1) The level and seriousness of the crime.
- (2) The date of the crime.
- (3) The age of the person at the time of the crime.
- (4) The circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, if known.
- (5) The nexus between the criminal conduct and the prospective duties of the applicant as a licensee.
- (6) The prison, jail, probation, parole, rehabilitation, and employment records of the applicant since the date the crime was committed.
- (6a) The completion of, or active participation in, rehabilitative drug or alcohol treatment.
- (6b) A Certification of Relief granted pursuant to NCGA 15A-173.2.
- (7) The subsequent commission of a crime by the applicant.
- (8) Any affidavits or other written documents, including character references.

MILITARY-TRAINED APPLICANTS/MILITARY SPOUSES

<u>Licensure for military-trained applicants/military spouses</u>: If you are a military spouse or a military-trained (applies for some types of occupational licenses) applicant you may be eligible for endorsement without meeting all of the requirements described in this application. The application must be properly completed, signed, notarized, accompanied by all required documents, proper fees, and dated no more than *thirty (30) days* prior to when your application is received by the office of the North Carolina Auctioneer Licensing Board (NCALB). It must be received, not postmarked, in the NCALB Office on, or before the Board deadline date established by the Board (dates enclosed). If any part of the application is incorrect or incomplete, or if required attachments are not included, the application may be returned, resulting in a delay in the licensing process.

The applicant on the auction firm application must be the owner, if the business is a sole proprietorship; a partner, if a partnership; an officer of the corporation, if incorporated; or a member manager, if a limited liability company.

Type or print legibly in ink, and mail the competed application to the Board office. Application may not be submitted by email or fax.

Remember to enclose a check made payable to the North Carolina Auctioneer Licensing Board (NCALB). The application fee is non-fundable. Please note it is a violation of 21 NCAC 4B . 0404 to submit a check to the Board in payment of required fees, which is returned unpaid.

If applying for an Auction Firm License with a non-auctioneer as a designated person, an auction firm examination is required pursuant to N.C.G.S. 85B-4(g). This office will contact you either by email (preferred method) or phone regarding scheduling and other exam information. If you are an auctioneer licensed in NC, you are exempt from the firm exam.

RESTRICTIONS AND EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS

Authority to transact business under a firm license is limited to the person or persons so designated in the application. The designated person or persons are required to satisfactorily pass a written examination on the Auctioneer Law and Rules. A currently licensed North Carolina auctioneer who is the designated person is not required to take the auction firm examination.

Licensed real estate brokers and real estate firms are exempt from the examination so long as they are involved in the selling of real property only (no personal property) at auction, and provided that they employ or associate themselves with a licensed auctioneer (requires Firm License) to handle those aspects of the transactions peculiar to the auctioneer profession.

Auction Firm examinations are given on Mondays and Thursdays at 1:30 p.m., if there is no prior conflicts, at the Board's office located at 108 Ber Creek Dr. Fuquay-Varina, NC 27526. Upon receipt of the application, supporting documents, and fees, Board staff will contact the applicant regarding the auction firm examination.

ESCROW ACCOUNT REQUIREMENTS

N.C.G.S. § 85B-7.1 Handling Clients Funds of the Auctioneers Law, and 21 NCAC 4B .0603 of the Rules and Regulations specifies the requirements concerning escrow accounts. Money, which has come into your possession through an auction sale, which is payable to the auctioneer or firm, and any portion that belongs to others, may not be commingled with your own under any circumstances N.C.G.S. § 85B-8(a)(7). In addition, such funds must be deposited in a trust or escrow account in a bank or savings and loan association **located in North Carolina**, within three business days of receiving the funds. Funds, which are disbursed to the seller on auction day, are not subject to the escrow account requirements; however, the Law and Rules specify certain record keeping requirements.

North Carolina Auction Firm Examination Information

The examination was designed to determine if the designated person has a working knowledge of the Auctioneer Law and Rules. The examination involves a possible score of 100 points; with a required minimum score of 75 points to pass the examination. The examination must be passed before the application can be presented to the Board.

Authority to transact business under a firm license is limited to the person or persons so designated in the application. The designated person or persons are required to satisfactorily pass a written examination on the Auctioneer Law and Rules **prior** to being licensed. A licensed auctioneer who is the designated person for a firm is <u>not</u> required to take the auction firm examination.

Licensed real estate brokers and real estate firms are <u>exempt</u> from the auction firm examination so long as they are involved in the selling of real property only at auction, and provided that they employ or associate themselves with a licensed auctioneer to handle those aspects of the transactions peculiar to the auctioneer profession.

The auction firm examination is given in Fuquay-Varina at the Board's offices. The office will contact you regarding the auction firm exam information upon receipt of the firm application, supporting documents, and fees. If you have any questions, you may contact the office.

All applications and supporting documentation are subject to the approval of the Licensing Board.

The firm exam will be graded within 3 business days. Examination score will be sent by email or regular mail, if examinee does not have an email address.

INFORMATION THAT MAY BE HELPFUL IN PREPARING FOR THE EXAMINATION

- 1. Be thoroughly familiar with the North Carolina Auctioneers Law and the North Carolina Auctioneer Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. There are available on the Board's website at www.ncalb.org.
